

Just to keep you up on things:

It is time to be getting all your member's dues paid.

Make sure all your officers dues are paid up to date and current. If not they will be removed.

Your quartermasters of all posts have a list of all members with 30, 60 and 90 days from expiration. There is no reason for this to happen.

You should have a membership committee in place. They could contact these members and find out why their dues have not been paid. If it's because of financial or health reasons, pay their dues, that is what the relief fund is there for. Their reason can be told to any officer or membership committee member without having to come to a meeting or telling the quartermaster in person.

In your spare time contact members you have not seen in a while. Make sure they are alright, ask if there's anything we can do for them and mainly find out if they have been mistreated so you can rectify the situation. Encourage them to return to the post.

Last year we had 107 posts with 100% in membership. I am looking forward to having a whole lot more this year.

Last but not least, we need to get new members so this organization can continue to help all Veterans past, present and future with their needs.

The 2nd quarter of the year has passed already. Audits are due to Department by the end of the month following the end of the quarter. The audit is the Trustee's report. The Quartermaster will provide all necessary paperwork to complete the audit, which is to be signed by the Trustees and the Commander.

All bonds should be in place and be of an adequate amount to cover all liquid assets of the post. The 990's are due by November 15th if your post is on the fiscal year; May

15th if you're on the calendar year. If your post grosses less than \$50,000.00 a year you can file a 990n.

Trustees and Quartermasters: take your time in doing the Audit to avoid mistakes. I have seen a lot of simple mistakes on the audits. Make sure the audit is signed by the Trustees and the Commander, not typed in. And please print legibly.

Seated with me was Lt Col Alexander



Reminder: Mid-Winter Conference is Jan. 18-21, 2018 in Kalamazoo





Madam President Dee Guillory final visit was Plymouth Post #6695 for reception and dinner. Madam President was


escorted by V.F.W. State Commander Matt David for Aisle of Flags.

JAMES EUROPE VFW POST 2233 HOLDS P.O.W./M.I.A. CEREMONY





ARMISTICE DAY 1918



This picture was taken on the first Armistice Day in 1918. It is composed of 30,000 men at Camp Custer (Battle Creek, MI) forming a human model of the United States to celebrate the end of WWI. It took several hours for the photographer, who was one of several engineered by a Chicago public relations firm, to get the proper symmetry and perspective. The war had ended and the men broke ranks again and again, the photograph was taken from atop a wooden tower on the parade ground, just off West Dickman Road.

The dark portions of the shield are formed by men in full uniform. The white portions are men in undershirts or bare-chested. Soldiers line up along pieces of white tape to form the shield. (From the book by Faye Clark "As You Were.") I believe that my Grandpa is in it, as he was stationed there, and I remember seeing this photo as child a couple times in a frame on the wall, when we were allowed to go to that room at their house. He was in the Mule Division. I believe in the cannon division.



We are asked to “Recruit and Retain” because membership is the Lifeblood of our Organization. Our Post will receive an award and congratulations for attaining 100% membership this year - 232 members! But alas, that is 100 less members than we had in 2010 - declines perhaps similar to other Posts in the Department. In early April our National membership totaled 1,148,766 members. In the mid 1990s those numbers totaled 2.5 million, a decline of 54% over the last 20 plus years. The reasons for the decline are certainly well known. Every year the Department strives to once again reach that magical 100% goal. But what does it really mean? Fifteen years ago I recall the Department membership totaling 65-70,000. This year the 100% bogie was 44,902. Now would be a good time for the MOV to publish the historical statistics of our Department membership. I’m asking that in the next issue of the MOV you publish a year history of the final Department membership count from years 2000 to 2017 and to list the Department Commander in office at that time. Show us the long term results of the yearly 100% membership goal drive. I’m hoping our readers and members will be enlightened and perhaps inspired to do better.



We started a challenge with Ohio two years ago to see which Department could raise the most money for the National Home. The winner gets a Bucket that is filled with cheer. Last year Ohio beat us by about \$1,200.00 so they got the Bucket. What Ohio doesn't understand is the Bucket belongs in Michigan. Thanks to your generous donations, we won the Bucket back. The Dept. of Michigan raised over \$56,000.00 for the National Home. Between Michigan and Ohio that weekend approx. \$95,000.00 was raised. Thank you to all the Posts in the Department that contributed to this fantastic cause.

Speaking of donations, when your post received solicitations for donations from various charities please consider donating to the VFW programs first. Keep in mind that the Dept. of Michigan takes nothing off the top of what you donate to cover expenses. If you donate \$1.00 to MAP, Cancer, or Scouting for example, \$1.00 goes to that program. You won't get a better bang for your buck anywhere else.

You've all heard about the devastation caused by the hurricanes in Texas, Louisiana, Florida, and Puerto Rico this past summer. A lot of comrades and their families lost their homes or had significant damage and needed help. The VFW was there for them. The National organization has an emergency relief fund set up for just this type of situation.
